By putting all these actors in one place, we hope to not only disseminate knowledge, but to create a space which opens dialogue on how to move forward and to discuss opportunities.

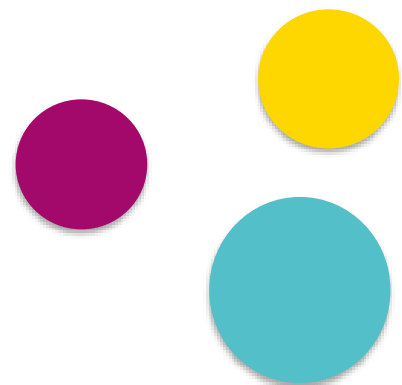
